Unfortunately the Paper Control Authorities have cut the size of this hand-book to 32 pages. Consequently the first full sized Handbook published after the War will contain this attractive feature and every 'Shire fan will be looking forward to this.

We publish some of the interesting facts that Mr. Livingstone has to relate.

The Club was formed in 1890. It has had five grounds. The first

where now stands Garrioch School, had the name of KELBURN PARK; the second, named KEL-VINSIDE PARK, was further up Garrioch Road and they entered this in 1900; the third, which was made possible by the help of the late Geo. Laurie, was known as the Magic Park, and rechristened NELSON PARK. After a year groundless, during which Ashfield and Maryhill kindly gave them the use of their parks, they entered in March, 1911, their fourth ground, BALMORÉ PARK, at the junction of Bilsland Drive and Balmore Road. In 1932 they again "were on the Trek" and this resulted in their present and lucky home, KEPPOCH. The club has given as many as 40 players in three years to Seniordom (1908-1911).
