Worcester City FC 1932/33 Season – some records show the “Friendlies” total goals as 6 but I believe that it may be overstated by one goal.

Worcester City FC 1933/34 Season - in other records the “All matches” total is given as 63 goals. The difference is a goal credited/not credited in each of two games – 23 September 1933 v Hereford United (League) and 20 January 1934 v Stourbridge (Worcs. FA Senior Cup). I believe the correct total is 64 goals. League records credit him with three goals against Hereford United but he only scored two goals – see note under “Club career as a player”. In the cup match

against Stourbridge he is credited with one goal. However, I believe the source of the score and goal scorers was a half-time report. He scored another goal in the second-half to make a total of two goals in a 5:1 win.

Glasgow Merchants' Charity Cup

This cup was first competed for in 1877 and the competition was organised by the Glasgow Charity Cup Committee that invited clubs from in and around Glasgow to take part. It was traditionally played for at the end of the season and the committee distributed the takings to local charities. The cup was last played for in 1966 and is now on display at the Scottish Football Museum, Hampden Park, Glasgow.

The Worcestershire Football Association Senior Cup

The cup was first played for in the 1893/94 season. At Alex Hair's time the competition was between WFA member clubs who played in the Birmingham League or Birmingham Combination. In addition Football League clubs (Aston Villa, Birmingham, West Bromwich Albion and Walsall) who had reserve/colts team in these leagues also took part. The cup is still competed for today.

The Keys Cup

The cup was donated by Harry Keys, a director/chairman of West Bromwich Albion, to the Birmingham & District League in 1904. It was to be presented to the highest placed club each season that was not a reserve/colts team of a Football League club. Today it is presented to the runners-up in the Premier Division of the West Midlands (Regional) League as the Birmingham & District League was re-named in 1962.
